### Tips

- ★ If your child wants to take the same classes as a friend, please coordinate with the friend's parents to ensure that you register for the same classes. Some classes are offered at multiple times.

- ★ A canteen is available for children to purchase snacks during the 20 minute break between the second and third class. Snack and drink prices vary from \$0.25 to \$1.00. Your child may also choose to bring a snack from home. A water cooler is available free of charge. Children in the 5- to 6-year old age group have a snack while in the classroom after the second class.

## Our Staff

Most instructors are teachers from local public and private schools who have designed their classes to promote creativity, decision-making skills, and self-esteem in participants.

In addition, we have parent volunteers who supervise the 5- to 6-year-old students and 7- to 8-year-old students between classes, at snack time, and during arrival and dismissal. All instructors and parent volunteers (in addition to all employees of Polk State College) are fingerprinted for safety reasons.

Individual classes are 1 hour 15 minutes in length and are scheduled between 8:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

## Classes for 5- to 6-Year-Olds

Participants in classes for 5- to 6-year-olds must take classes in all three time slots during a session. This reduces the disruptions during the program and provides an extra level of safety for your child.

## Classes for 7- to 8-Year-Olds

Students in the 7- to 8-year-old age group are escorted to all classes and are **NOT** free to roam the campus.

## Classes for 9- to 14-Year-Olds

The two older age groups, 9- to 10-year-olds and 11- to 14-year-olds, are **not escorted to class**. Classes are centrally located, and most participants only change classes within a hallway or to different floors of the same building.

# CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

## BOK ACADEMY

### **Abstract Art** KAC1025

*Discover the world of abstract art, where it doesn't matter if you can draw a horse or not.* Find a new way to express yourself with strokes and colors. See what effect different types of music make on your creativity. Amaze yourself with how many colors you can create. Cindy Landen, Art teacher at Dale R. Fair Babson Park Elementary and 2006-2007 Teacher of the Year Runner Up in the Charter School system, will help you discover the world of abstract art.

### **All about Computer Innards** KAC1740

*Have you ever looked inside a computer?* Can you identify the parts inside? Do you know what they do? Why they work? How they work together? In this course we will take computers apart, put them back together, and learn about all the things we find inside. Robert Lamar, PhD in Computer Science, will teach you the answers to these questions and so much more.

### **BFF/Babysitting** KAC1040

*This is a dual course for you and your best friend!* Beauty, Fitness, and Fashion will focus on manicures, pedicures, beauty tips, fashion, and workouts, as well as loving yourself from the inside out. Do you love little ones and are interested in becoming a great babysitter? Then you will love using these baby dolls to practice babysitting techniques for diapering, feeding, and playing with little ones. You will be able to test your decision-making skills and become a confident, responsible babysitter—what every parent wants! Grab your BFF and join instructor Nicole Goodman, a second grade teacher at Hillcrest Elementary, for this fun and exciting course. **ADDITIONAL LAB FEE: \$15.00**

### **Board Game Blitz** KAC1080

*Playing board games such as Monopoly, Risk, Life, and Stratego, as well as others, can help us understand our history, the present, and our future.* These are just a few of the great games we will be learning to play this summer. Each week we will learn how to play new games, and then return to enjoy some old favorites. We will go over the rules together and then divide up to play. We will also look at great ways each game can help us learn skills that can benefit us in the classroom and in life. So, whether you are a board game expert or you've never played one before, this class is the best place to be this summer! Your instructor is Chris Euverard, "Coach E", a Social Studies teacher at Lake Region High School.

### **Cheerleading 101** KAC1140

*Have you always dreamed of being a cheerleader?* Now is your opportunity to make your dream come true! *Cheerleading 101* will give you the chance to build cheerleading skills such as sideline chants, motion and jump techniques, and cheers. Your instructor will be Jenna Barron, a Janie Howard Wilson Elementary first grade teacher. She has competed nationally with Cheer Elite and has experience as a high school JV cheerleading coach.



### **Codes and Puzzles** KAC1760

*What's the best way to keep a secret?* People have wanted to keep secrets for thousands of years. Codes, ciphers, and encryption have helped us keep messages hidden from prying eyes. In this course, we will be analyzing different kinds of codes and puzzles to learn how they work and how they have developed over time. Unlock some codes and puzzles with Robert Lamar, PhD.

### **Exploring the Rainforest** KAC1780

*What do chocolate, popcorn, cola, and salsa have in common?* They are all foods whose ingredients were originally discovered in the rainforest. During this workshop, students will explore the wonders of cooking with foods that have been provided from the rainforest. Highlights from our menu will include: "Flying Lizard on a Stick," "Howler Monkey Brains," and "Fried Butterfly Wings." Each child will be making a cookbook to take home at the end of the session. Your instructor will be Jennifer Fetes, a fourth grade teacher at Davenport School of the Arts.

### **Fun-with-Video** KAC1280

*Fun-with-Video provides kids with the opportunity to use video cameras and edit the film using iMovie software.* We will explore digital storytelling and filming techniques as we create awesome videos. Your instructor is Paul Rigel of the Bok Academy. **ADDITIONAL LAB FEE: \$10.00**

### **Munchable Math** KAC1800

*Join your friends and munch your way through multiple math activities!* During this course we will use a variety of candies and snacks to demonstrate math activities. We will make geometric shapes, and explore place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and (depending on age group) graphing and measurement. Students will discover the relationships between food and math. Valerie Wellman, a first grade teacher at Janie Howard Wilson and 2007 Teacher of the Year, will be your instructor.

### **Renaissance Alive!** KAC1820

*Be the ruler of your own realm as the Renaissance takes hold!* Learn about the powerful people and the tense relationships you must navigate as you make your country more "civilized." Study the "tricks of the trades" from local knights and merchants. Using primary sources, analyze Renaissance art and philosophy to find out what makes the Renaissance so different from the Dark Ages. Construct a presentation that will convince your local nobles to fund an art form or maestro of your choice. Who knows? The Renaissance might even show up at your back door! Katherine Lamar, an eighth grade teacher at Bok Academy, will guide you through this exciting period in history.

Jason Brewner, a 2009 Polk County Science Teacher of the Year finalist, will open your eyes to the fun side of science.

### Target Archery KAC1880

*Come learn the fundamentals of target archery, equipment handling, skill, focus, muscular endurance, and safety.* Your instructor is Nancy Leatherland, Physical Education instructor at Hillcrest School of the Arts.

### World Music Drumming KAC1900

*World Music Drumming will provide students with the opportunity to create percussion music in the African and Latin traditions.* Students will create, improvise, dance and sing. Come on a musical adventure with Micky Caban, 2004 Teacher of the Year at Janie H. Wilson Elementary.

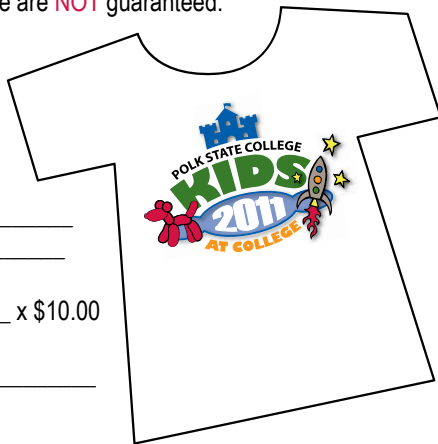
