POLK STATE GATEWAY TO COLLEGE CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL

SCHOOL CLIMATE SURVEY 2018

An external evaluator from Smart Teams created this report, summarizing the responses of Polk State Gateway to College Charter High School's stakeholders on the school's 2018 climate survey. The report provides an overall summary of survey results as well as an examination of responses by survey category.

Part 1

The Polk State Gateway to College Charter High School Climate Survey was administered to parents, students, and staff members in the winter and spring of the 2017-2018 school year. The number of participants in each category included:

- 45 parents
- 103 students
- 11 staff members

These numbers represent approximately 23% of the school's parents, 51% of students, and 100% of full-time staff.

Survey items are organized around seven categories or correlates associated with characteristics that are evident in highly effective schools. Categories include:

- Correlate 1/Safe and Orderly Environment
- Correlate 2/High Expectations
- Correlate 3/Instructional Leadership
- Correlate 4/Clear School Mission
- Correlate 5/Opportunity to Learn
- Correlate 6/Frequent Monitoring of Student Progress
- Correlate 7/Home-School Community Relationship

The survey template lists 24 statements about the school. For each survey item, the respondent is asked to indicate whether he or she strongly disagrees (1), disagrees (2), agrees (3), or strongly agrees (4).

Part 2 (page 4) of this report, provides a summary of responses by correlate for each stakeholder group. Selected overall observations for all respondents are as listed below:


- A total of 159 stakeholder representatives participated in the survey process.
- The overall responses by group are:
 - Students 3.44
 - Parents 3.39
 - o Staff 3.60
- Both students (3.55) and parents (3.48) gave the highest rating to *High Expectations*. Staff (3.75) allotted the highest rating to *Clear School Mission*.
- Both students (3.27) and parents (3.23) bestowed the lowest rating to *Frequent Monitoring of Student Progress*. Staff gave the lowest rating (3.52) to both *Frequent Monitoring of Student Progress* and *Safe and Orderly Environment*.
- The mean or average scores for parents, students, and staff are 3 or higher for all seven survey categories or correlates. The school thus meets the requirements of one of its charter goals, which states, "The average responses of students, parents, and staff equals 3.0 or higher on at least 6 of 7 correlates on the annual climate survey (scale of 1.0 to 4.0)"

Part 2

The columns in **Table 1** list the seven survey correlates. The rows list mean responses of stakeholder groups on the items included in each correlate. Additionally, the final column to the right lists the average or mean score for the stakeholder group. The bold mean score in each row is the highest reported for the group.

Three survey items, included in the scores listed in **Figure 1** (page 4), are tied to two issues deemed to be significant enough in importance to also be reported independently:

- Bullying
- Overall satisfaction with the school

The mean responses of stakeholder groups for each of these individual items are listed in **Table 2**.
