- 2. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete MAT 1033 in order to enroll in MAC 1105, or complete MAT 1100 to enroll in MGF 1106 or MGF 1107. MAT 1033 or MAT 1100 are not included in the total number of hours in this program of study.



- 3. Students must take one of the approved Mathematics General Education Courses in this program: MAC 1105, MAC 2311, MGF 1106, MGF 1107, or STA 2023.
- 4. Students must take one of the approved Humanities General Education Courses in this program: ARH 2000, HUM 2020, LIT 1000, MUL 1010, PHI 2010, or THE 1000.
- 5. Students interested in earning a bachelor's degree are encouraged to earn 18 credits in General Education by completing either a 3-credit-hour science and a 3-credit hour wellness course or a 4-credit hour science and a 2-credit hour wellness course.
- 6. Students must take one of the approved Natural Science General Education Courses in this program: AST 1002C, BSC 1005C, BSC 1010, BSC 2085C, CHM 1045C, EVR 1001C, PHY 2020C, PHY 2048C, or PHY 2053.
- 7. Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of either AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the two courses options.
- 8. Students may select from one of the following courses: ASC 2560, CCJ 2932, CCJ 2940, CJC 2005, CJC 2162, or CJE 2640.

Minimum Graduation Requirements

To qualify for graduation at Polk State College, a student must:

- Complete all degree-seeking admission requirements, including the submission of all necessary transcripts and other required documents.
- 2. Complete the required credit hours in a prescribed program of study.
- 3. Complete any other applicable requirements (e.g., some occupational and technical programs require a grade of C or better in all program courses).
- 4. Have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.00. A minimum cumulative program GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation with a credit or vocational certificate, or an Applied Technology Diploma.
- 5. For Associate in Arts and Baccalaureate Degree programs ONLY, satisfy the foreign language requirement for graduation, which is proficiency at college-level II (or the equivalent).
- Complete at least 25 percent of the credit hours required for the degree or certificate through instruction offered at Polk State College.
