A Few Notes

- 1. Students must meet all graduation requirements. To learn more about graduation requirements, refer to the last page of this program map and to <u>the College Catalog</u>.
- Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of either AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the two courses options.
- 3. Students must have completed EMS 1059C, an approved transfer course, or the Emergency Medical Responder program at Ridge Technical College to enroll in the Emergency Medical Technology Certificate program. Students who complete the Emergency Medical Responder program at Ridge Technical College are eligible to enroll in the Emergency Medical Technology Certificate program but will not receive credit for EMS 1059C.
- 4. Students must hold a valid Florida Emergency Medical Technology Certificate to be admitted to the Paramedic Certificate program. Students must also complete BSC 2085C and BSC 2086C. Although not required for program admission, completion of ENC 1101, HUM 2020, and AMH 1020 or POS 2041 is considered as part of the program admission process. - 5. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete MAT 1033 in order to enroll in MAC 1105, or complete MAT 1100 in order to enroll in MGF 1106.

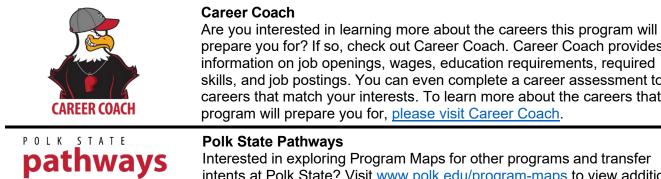


Minimum Graduation Requirements

To qualify for graduation at Polk State College, a student must:

- 1. Complete all degree-seeking admission requirements, including the submission of all necessary transcripts and other required documents.
- 2. Complete the required credit hours in a prescribed program of study.
- 3. Complete any other applicable requirements (e.g., some occupational and technical programs require a grade of C or better in all program courses).
- 4. Have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.00. A minimum cumulative program GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation with a credit or vocational certificate, or an Applied Technology Diploma.
- 5. For Associate in Arts and Baccalaureate Degree programs **ONLY**, satisfy the foreign language requirement for graduation, which is proficiency at college-level II (or the equivalent).
- 6. Complete at least 25 percent of the credit hours required for the degree or certificate through instruction offered at Polk State College.
