A Few Notes

- 1. Students must meet all graduation requirements. To learn more about graduation requirements, refer to the last page of this program map and to the College Catalog.
- Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students
 must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam
 and by completion of either AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or
 POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one
 of the two courses options.
- 3. BSC 2086C Human Anatomy and Physiology II must be completed prior to Term 2 of the program if it has not already completed during the program or before program admission.
- 4. HSC 2554 Basic Principles of Disease must be completed prior to Term 3 of the program if it has not already completed during the program or before program admission.
- 5. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete MAT 1033 in order to enroll in MAC 1105, or complete MAT 1100 in order to enroll in MGF 1106.
- 6. MGF 1106 Topics in Mathematics, MAC 1105 College Algebra, or STA 2023 Introduction to Probability and Statistics must be completed prior to Term 4 (summer semester of second year) of the program if it has not already completed during the program or before program admission.
- 7. PHI 2010 Introduction to Philosophy must be completed prior to term 5 (fall semester of second year) of the program if it has not already completed during the program or before program admission.

Minimum Graduation Requirements

To qualify for graduation at Polk State College, a student must:

- Complete all degree-seeking admission requirements, including the submission of all necessary transcripts and other required documents.
- 2. Complete the required credit hours in a prescribed program of study.
- 3. Complete any other applicable requirements (e.g., some occupational and technical programs require a grade of C or better in all program courses).
- 4. Have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.00. A minimum cumulative program GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation with a credit or vocational certificate, or an Applied Technology Diploma.
- 5. For Associate in Arts and Baccalaureate Degree programs ONLY, satisfy the foreign language requirement for graduation, which is proficiency at college-level II (or the equivalent).
- Complete at least 25 percent of the credit hours required for the degree or certificate through instruction offered at Polk State College.
