Issue:

Polk State College District Board of Trustees Rule 5.22 grants the President authority to dispose of tangible personal property in accordance with Section 274.02, Florida Statutes. A report must be submitted to the District Board of Trustees showing the items that are to be disposed of under this delegation.

Background/Analysis:

Submitted for your approval are tangible personal property items to be disposed of and removed from the College's property records. Forty-five (45) non-capitalized items and three (3) capitalized items are either being donated or scrapped.

Fiscal Impact:

This action reduces the number of items recorded on the College's inventory records for tangible personal property. Non-capitalized property is expensed in the year of purchase, and its removal from College records has no impact on the financial statements. Disposal of the capitalized item reduces the value of capital equipment and associated accumulated depreciation on Polk's financial statements.

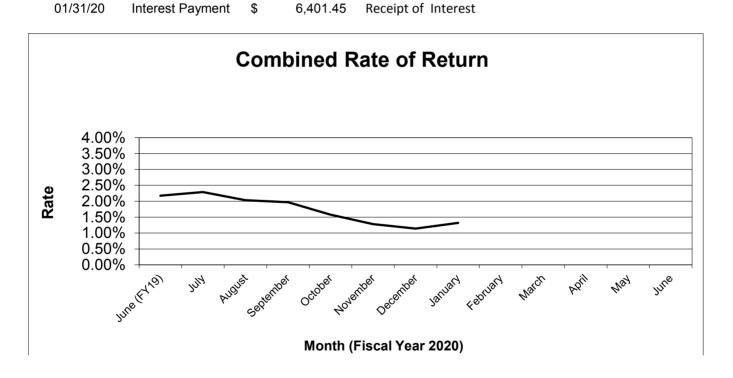

Polk State Chain of Lakes Collegiate High School (COL) 2020 Recruitment/Enrollment Timeline

FEBRUARY

MARCH

- COL will hold recruit nights February 6 and February 20, 2020. The purpose of these information sessions is to inform potential students and their parents about COL and its purpose.
- Applications will be made available online as of February 1- March 2, 2020.
- COL has seats for approximately 175 students for entrance in August 2020. Recruitment will target applicants who have a 3.0 grade point average and will have earned the high school credits required to be considered a junior or a senior as of August 2020. Every applicant must also take the PERT.

- In order to be considered for enrollment, an individual must submit a completed application with verified grade point average and PERT scores by the March 2, 2020 deadline. (Lottery number deadline is March 2, 2020).
- If there are more qualified applicants than there are available seats, students will be assigned lottery numbers.
- The order of acceptance will then be as follows:
- Every student that submits a completed application by the March 2 deadline receives a randomly assigned lottery number. A completed application must include Transcript that displays students full name, PERT scores, and GPA 3.0.
- If there are more qualified applicants than openings, acceptance will be according to lottery number beginning with dual enrollment qualified applicants with 2/3 or 3/3 PERT cut scores.
- Admission preference to qualified sibling(s) of current student, child of active military, child of governing board member, or COL staff.
- Using the order of acceptance listed above, COL will send letters of acceptance to students by the end of March based on the number of available seats. If there are more qualified students than available seats, lottery numbers will be used to determine the order in which additional students will be accepted if additional seats become available.
- Acceptance letters will be sent to up to 175 students who meet all application requirements.

APRIL-AUGUST

- Applicants receiving letters of acceptance must return their enrollment forms by mid-April in order to hold their seats for the 2020-2021 class.
- Students meeting application requirements who are not part of the group receiving acceptance letters, will be sent letters saying they are on a waiting list.
- Students who do not meet the qualifications will be sent a letter stating that they do not meet the minimum requirements.
- Students submitting completed applications after the March 2 deadline will not be considered for enrollment until all qualified students on the waiting list have been offered the opportunity to enroll.
- On June 1, COL will determine if the incoming class for the upcoming school year reflects the diversity of the designated community attendance zone as stated in the existing charter agreement. After June 1, the school must work towards having diverse community representation as it continues to accept students for the upcoming school year. The designated community for COL is the attendance area for all East Polk County High Schools.
