A Few Notes:

- Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of AMH 1010 (History of the United States: 1607-1877), AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the threecourse options.
- 2. TPP1290L Technical Theatre must be completed one time for the Theatre Pathway and can be taken up to four times for credit.
- 3. Students need two natural sciences general education courses. One must include a lab.



- 4. TPP1190L Rehearsal and Performance is offered most terms in connection with a college production and can be completed up to four times for credit as an elective.
- 5. The AA degree requires the completion of 60 credit hours, including 36 credit hours of General Education courses and 24 credit hours of elective courses. This transfer intent requires the completion of additional courses in order to meet all pre-requisites for admission into a bachelor's degree program at a state university. These additional courses are in excess of required program hours and may not be covered by financial aid. Students should speak to their Student Success Advisor for more information.

A Few Notes:

- 1. TPP1290L Technical Theatre and TPP1190L Rehearsal and Performance must be completed one time for the Theatre Pathway and can be taken up to four times for credit.
- 2. Students need two natural sciences general education courses. One must include a lab.

Minimum Graduation Requirements

To qualify for graduation at Polk State College, a student must:

- Complete all degree-seeking admission requirements, including the submission of all necessary transcripts and other required documents.
- 2. Complete the required credit hours in a prescribed program of study.
- 3. Complete any other applicable requirements (e.g., some occupational and technical programs require a grade of C or better in all program courses).
- 4. Have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.00. A minimum cumulative program GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation with a credit or vocational certificate, or an Applied Technology Diploma.
- 5. **For Associate in Arts and Baccalaureate Degree programs**ONLY, satisfy the foreign language requirement for graduation, which is proficiency at college-level II (or the equivalent).
- Complete at least 25 percent of the credit hours required for the degree or certificate through instruction offered at Polk State College.
