A Few Notes:

1. Students must test into MUT 1111. If minimum requirements are not met through the preliminary exam, then students must complete MUT 1001 as a prerequisite. To prevent students from delaying their progress, they can complete MUT1001 in term 1, MUT 1111 in term 2, and MUT 1112 in term 3, along with their corequisites.
2. Applied lesson courses include any course with a MVB, MVK, MVP, MVS, MVV, or MVW prefix. Students are recommended to take MVK 1111 and MVK 1112, except for piano majors.
3. Ensemble courses include any course with a MUN prefix.
4. Students are required to complete two 3-credit Mathematics courses; one course must be from List A; the other can be from List A or B.
5. Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of AMH 1010 (History of the United States: 1607-1877), AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the three-course options.
6. Students are required to complete at least one 4-credit Natural Sciences course with a lab. The Natural Sciences courses may be completed in any order if this requirement is fulfilled.
7. The AA degree requires the completion of 60 credit hours, including 36 credit hours of General Education courses and 24 credit hours of elective courses. This transfer intent requires the completion of additional courses to meet all prerequisites for admission into a bachelor's degree program at a state university. These additional courses are in excess of required program hours and may not be covered by financial aid. Students should speak to their Student Success Advisor for more information.
