- 3. Students who enter with an AA degree must complete 18 credit hours of technical courses. The technical courses include all 1000- and 2000-level courses within the AS Supply Chain Management. Program prerequisites may satisfy a portion of the technical requirements.
- 4. Students may choose an upper-level elective course from the following approved courses: FIN 3403, GEB 3356, ISM 4011, MAN 4162, MAN 4301, MAN 4940, MAR 4802, RMI 3004, SCM 3162, SCM 3212, TRA 3204.
- 5. Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of either AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the two courses options.
- 6. Admission to SCM 4950, Capstone Experience: Supply Chain Management, requires the approval of the Program Director which is contingent upon successful completion of all required program core and concentration courses.
