

High School Crime Camp Dress Code

The student's appearance is a direct reflection of Polk State College as well as the criminal justice profession in which they are interested in entering.

Students should always present themselves in a professional manner. As a group, we will be participating in tours at potential future employers.

UPPER ATTIRE

Shirts

Garments must cover the entire shoulder and from neckline to waist. Students' midriff shall not be seen at any time.

No lace or sheer materials, including "cut outs."

BOTTOM ATTIRE

Pants or Jeans. No shorts, leggings/yoga pants or skirts.

Must be worn securely at the waist. No rips or tears in clothing.

FOOTWEAR

Footwear should be enclosed and suitable for physical activity.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- No garments shall contain insignias or logos related to drugs, alcohol, violence, gangs, weapons, sexually suggestive or offensive topics.
- Wearing apparel, which tends to identify association with secret societies or gangs as prohibited in Florida Statutes
- No undergarments are to be seen at any time.
- Head coverings (bandanas, sweatbands, hoods, ski masks and du-rags, etc.) will not be allowed inside the building.
- No sunglasses can be worn inside buildings.
- Any jewelry or accessory that presents a safety or health hazard or causes a major disruption to the educational process is not allowed.

MONDAY AFTERNOON

Monday we will be completing the obstacle course.

Students should bring a change of clothing for the afternoon session. Students may wear athletic apparel to include an appropriate T-shirt and jogging shorts. They should wear shoes that permits them to run and jump. The shorts should not be shorter than 2 inches above the knee.
