

Bachelor of Science in Nursing RN-BSN Program

The Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) program is for individuals who hold a current license as a registered nurse (RN). Applicants are required to have completed an associate degree prior to enrollment in the RN-BSN Program. Program coursework is completed online, except for experiential learning hours and practicum. The program can be completed in as little as three semesters, or as slowly as taking one course at a time.

A mandatory online program meeting is required for all students admitted into the program.

Admission: Students must first apply to Polk State College and meet all general admission requirements for baccalaureate programs. Students who are already Polk State Students will need to apply to the college as a returning student to declare the baccalaureate in nursing as the desired program. Students must have an active RN license to begin and to progress through the program (with the exception of concurrent enrollment (see below)). In addition to the Polk State College application, all applicants must apply to the RN to BSN program with an application through ETRIEVE, the application windows are as follows:

Fall Semester Start:

- Early Admissions: January 15 March 1
- Late Admissions: March 15 March 25
- *Students are admitted once per semester.

Spring Semester Start:

- Early Admissions: June 1 September 1
- Late Admissions: October 15 October 25

Concurrent Enrollment:

Any student who is currently enrolled in Polk State's ASN program with at least a 3.0 GPA, has completed the BSN core requirements and is entering Nursing 3, may apply to the RN to BSN program as a concurrent enrolled student. Concurrently enrolled students may take one (1) BSN class at a time with any ASN course (One in each fast track, or one 16 week course). Should the student be unsuccessful in an ASN course while enrolled concurrently in the RN to BSN program, students may not take any additional RN to BSN courses until completion of Nursing 4.

RN to BSN Homeroom Canvas Course:

All accepted students into the RN to BSN course will be enrolled in the RN to BSN Homeroom Canvas Course. This course will house the RN to BSN student handbook, documents, support materials (such as APA resources, instructions for accessing the Polk State library and frequently requested links), as well as important program announcements. The Course will also house important drop boxes for submission of current RN licensure, CPR, and required immunizations.

Experiential Learning and Clinical Requirements:

Experiential learning hours are required for NUR4638C Community and Public Health. In addition, practicum/clinical hours are required for NUR4940C Capstone Nursing Practicum. An active RN license is required for courses with experiential and/or clinical hours. Students are expected to maintain an active, unrestricted license as a RN; current certification in CPR; and immunization requirements as noted in the RN to BSN Student Handbook.

Additional Program Information:

- RN-BSN program coursework requires access to a reliable computer and internet connection.
- Students must take NUR3825 Professional Identity in Nursing in the *first term* of the RN-BSN program.
- Students are encouraged to take any remaining general ed., civic literacy, and electives during the summer semesters.
- Any nursing certifications (such as CCRN, TNCC, etc.) earned may be used toward 16 of your 32 required practicum hours. Students will be strongly encouraged to complete any certifications prior to Capstone enrollment. Additional information will be given upon admission.
