1. Email the professor of the class. *-Explain that you are considering withdrawing from the course and ask for suggestions on how you can be more successful.*
2. Attend at least 3 TLCC tutoring sessions for the specific course.
3. Schedule a parent meeting with Mrs. Black and Mrs. Allen
4. Complete Polk State's Student Request for Withdrawal form

*Seniors it is recommended that you contact the admissions offices of the colleges you are interested in before withdrawing to find out their policy regarding withdrawals.
