For seniors continuing their education at Polk State College, please adhere to the admissions steps as a First-Time-In-College (FTIC) Student. FTIC is a student who has never attended college or earned less than 12 college credits <u>after</u> high school graduation. Admissions steps include reapplying to the College, completing an online orientation, register for a virtual Preadvising session, establish Florida residency, apply for financial aid (if applicable), submit high school transcripts and register for classes. All final high school transcripts will be sent to Polk State College once our high school spring calendar ends on May 18. FTIC Students are required to complete SLS1122-First Year Seminar.
