- 3. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete MAT 1033 in order to enroll in MAC 1105 or complete MAT 1100 in order to enroll in MGF 1106. Students may also take any math course for which MAC 1105 is a pre-requisite.
- 4. Students may complete BSC 2086C, DEP 2004, ENC 1102, Humanities, and MCB 2010C prior to program admission or in any term prior to the term in which the course is listed.
