A Few Notes:

- 1. Students must meet all graduation requirements. To learn more about graduation requirements, please refer to the College Catalog.
- 2. Students must complete ENC 1101, BSC 2085C, and PSY 2012 before they apply to the program. Students may complete MGF 1106 or MAC 1105, Humanities, and HSC 1531 at any time before the end of the program. It is preferred that students complete HSC 1531 prior to enrolling in OTH 1800. Students must complete BSC 2086C prior to enrolling in OTH 1800.
- 3. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete MAT 1033 in order to enroll in MAC 1105 or complete MAT 1100 in order to enroll in MGF 1106.
- 4. Students may complete HSC 2554 prior to program admission. However, HSC 2544C must be completed prior to or at the same time as Term 3 courses. Students must complete the course prior to taking Term 4 courses.
