- A fully accredited public charter collegiate high school operated by Polk State College under a 15year contract agreement with the Polk County Public Schools

- Florida High-Performing Charter School
- Consistent school grade of "A"

Traditional Dual Enrollment

- Student remains at zoned high school and works with their school to add college courses on the high school campus, Polk State's campus, and/or online.
- Subject to schedule coordination with high school classes and time slots.
- Limited to site-based courses during school day.

COL Collegiate

- Student leaves zoned school and enrolls full-time at COL.
 Collegiate. All HS and collegelevel courses are taken on Polk State's campus with wide flexibility.
- Full-time COL Collegiate faculty and staff with expert knowledge and support.
- Mature environment that best suits serious-minded, focused students.
- Offer wide range of college-level courses during school day.

Students who are the best fit for COL Collegiate

- Able to handle flexible schedule and less structure
- Willing to work with COL Collegiate staff in course and course and degree planning
- <u>Eager</u> to engage in the culture of the school and build leadership skills
 - Join Clubs & Organizations participation
 - **Engage** in Community Service
 - Attend all required meetings and events
- Plan for postsecondary transition
 - ACT/SAT
 - College admissions process / post-high school plan

Expectations for COL Students

- Timely completion of all assignments
 - No recovery packets/late work
 - No expectation for extra credit opportunities
- Abide by all Student Performance Contract requirements
- Realistic expectations of the rigorous curriculum

Parents Who are The Best Fit for COL

- Engage in school culture
- Ensure consistent attendance and minimal tardiness for their student
- Agreeable to participating in school improvement initiatives such as surveys, focus groups, and committees
- <u>Support</u> the staff in encouraging students to comply with school policies and procedures

Expectations of COL Parents

- Complete all enrollment documentation promptly
- Ensure regular and consistent attendance in all classes
- Require student accountability
 - Monitor student progress
 - Trust but verify
 - Communicate with staff as appropriate (ParentSquare)

COL Pre-Collegiate

10th Grade

- Engage in a rigorous high school curriculum with good attendance and grades
- Complete all state testing requirements (B.E.S.T., EOC, etc.) with passing scores
- Become fully college-ready by the end of the school year (PERT, GPA, skills, maturity, etc.).
- Participate in the school's culture and build leadership skills

COL Collegiate 11th & 12th

11th & 12th Grade

- Complete requirements for two-year college degree/career pathway
- Participate in the school's culture and build leadership skills
- Attend monthly class meetings and college planning workshops
- Actively seek to qualify and apply for various scholarships
- Graduate with Florida high school diploma and two-year college degree
- Follow postsecondary transition plan
- Fully supported by COL staff
- Complete all staté testing requirements (B.E.S.T., EOC, etc.) with passing scores

Program Cost

All tuition, fees, and textbooks are provided FREE OF CHARGE to all COL Collegiate students.

 Excludes required uniforms, art supplies, cameras, and miscellaneous items for specialty courses

Additional costs to student/family:

- Student enrichment dues (suggested \$75 per student annually)
- Club dues (required for some clubs)
- School events (prom, homecoming, Grad Bash, etc.)
- Graduation items (cap and gown, invitations, etc.)
- Yearbook purchase
- School pictures and senior portraits (including sitting fee)

Associate Degree Programs

Associate in Arts Degree

- First two years of a four-year degree
- Transferrable to any university or college in Florida
- Transferrable outside of Florida in most cases
- Students should work to choose a degree program as soon as possible to ensure they are taking the appropriate courses
- Students should use personalized degree audits to track degree progress

Associate Degree Programs

Associate in Science Degree

- Career-focused in areas such as health sciences, public safety, or business programs
- Not designed for transfer to all institutions
- Some degrees are transferrable to bachelor degree programs
- Some program courses are only available after high school graduation

Common Questions

Can I play sports?

Yes – at a district or private school with approval

Can I participate in marching band?

No. Only programs that are extracurricular, not co-curricular

Is bus transportation available?

- No school bus transportation is available
- Winter Haven Area Transit is free for all students

What if I am eligible for free/reduced lunch?

 COL provides one free meal per school day for all students through Polk State's food service provider

Common Questions

Will my college credits transfer?

- Yes. In Florida, transfer rules apply to the state's 2+2 program
- Polk State is fully accredited; most credits are transferrable anywhere

Will most universities and colleges accept COL Collegiate High School graduates?

 Yes. Universities and colleges are looking for students who succeed in an academically rigorous program and achieve competitive ACT/SAT scores.

Will I be required to graduate as soon as I complete my high school requirements?

• No. Students are permitted to complete their senior year even if taking all dual enrollment (college) courses.

Admissions Information

- 10th Grade Pre-Collegiate Admissions Criteria:
 - Unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - Minimum PERT scores of:
 - 92 in Reading
 - 92 in Writing
 - 100 in Mathematics

- 11th and 12th Grade Collegiate Program Admissions Requirements:
 - Unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - Minimum PERT scores of:
 - 106 in Reading
 - 103 in Writing
 - 114 in Mathematics

How to Apply

• STEP 1: Apply to Polk State College

- Student Status: Dual-Enrollment
- Start Term Fall of the upcoming school year
- Allow 3-5 days to receive your Welcome Email from Polk State College.
- CLICK HERE FOR POLK STATE COLLEGE APPLICATION

• STEP 2: Schedule and take the PERT test:

- You will need to provide your Polk State College student ID number provided in your Welcome Email to take the PERT.
- CLICK HERE TO SCHEDULE THE PERT EXAM

• STEP 3: Apply to Chain of Lakes Collegiate High School:

- You must use your Polk State College email to access the high school application. (handout)
- Click "S" for student application.
- CLICK HERE TO APPLY TO CHAIN OF LAKES COLLEGIATE HIGH SCHOOL

Acceptance Process

- 1. All students who complete the application and submit by the deadline will be considered.
- 2. Acceptance priority is based on meeting minimum dual enrollment eligibility requirements: a 3.0 grade-point average and meeting minimum PERT testing requirements.
- 3. If there are more eligible students than available spots, a lottery list will be created by the Polk County Public Schools of all eligible students.
- 4. Acceptance letters will be sent out in March.

Acceptance Process...

- 5. Students must accept the offer of admission within two weeks.
- 6. Students not accepted will be placed on a waiting list by lottery number.
- 7. Late applications will be accepted but will not be included in the initial lottery.
- 8. Provisions are in place for siblings of current COL students and students of active military parents.
