

DEFINITIONS OF ADMISSION OPTIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make
a commitment to
a first-choice institution where, if
admitted they definitely will enroll and
withdraw all other
applications. The
application deadline
and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.





WHAT IS THE CLT?

The CLT is a college entrance exam for 11th & 12th graders that serves as an alternative to the SAT and ACT. In the state of Florida, students can utilize the CLT to:

- apply to colleges in Florida and across the U.S.*
- satisfy graduation requirements
- · earn Bright Futures scholarships
- · become eligible for dual enrollment

Students can take the CLT online from home by signing up at cltexam.com. Test dates are offered nearly every month throughout the year. Schools can also opt to administer the CLT. Ask your school if it plans to administer the CLT this year.

*CLT is accepted for admissions at over 250 colleges and universities across the U.S., including many in Florida. To view a full list of colleges accepting the CLT, visit cltexam.com/colleges.





What is the FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, is the form that the federal government, states, colleges and other organizations use to award financial aid. Submitting it is your key to accessing grants, scholarships, work-study programs and federal student loans.

Completing the FAFSA is the first step for anyone making college plans. But you should also know what other options are available and how much you can afford to borrow. Everything starts with the FAFSA. Submit the FAFSA each year you're in college — it only takes 30 minutes on average to complete when you're prepared.



And heads up: the redesigned FAFSA is expected to launch in December 2023 for the 2024-25 academic year — a delay from the typical Oct. 1 release date. You can still submit the 2023-24 FAFSA until June 30, 2024. Stay tuned for more updates on the new FAFSA deadline










- Transcript Request form is available in CHS Front office. (Not needed for Common App!)
