- Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of AMH 1010 (History of the United States: 1607-1877), AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the three-course options.
- 2. Students are required to complete two 3-credit Mathematics courses. One course must be from List A; the other can be from List A or B. <u>Refer to the College Catalog</u> for Mathematics Lists A and B.
