## 2024-25 DUAL ENROLLMENT ELIGIBILITY AND TESTING INFORMATION

Florida Rule 6A-10.0315 was updated in the Spring of 2022 and now allows students more opportunities to qualify to take Dual Enrollment courses. In addition to meeting the unweighted GPA requirements, students may meet the testing requirement through any combination of **several assessments** and even a high enough final grade in **several high school courses** (see tables below).

**Regarding PERT testing in 2024-25**, there must be 30 days between PERT attempts, and appropriate remediation provided.

- Students who have already taken <u>any</u> of the following assessments: PSAT, ACT, SAT, PERT; and have met the GPA requirement, are eligible to enroll in <u>College Success (SLS1101)</u> with Polk State College. They do not need to take the PERT.
- Students who have met the threshold score requirement from any of the Assessments in <u>Table 1</u> do not need to take the PERT to qualify in that subject area.
- Students who have already taken any of the following assessments: PSAT, ACT, SAT, PERT; and have met the eligibility criteria in <u>Table 2</u> do not need to take the PERT in that subject area.
