## A Few Notes:

- 1. BSC 2086C Anatomy and Physiology II must be completed prior to Term 3 of the program if it has not already completed prior to program admission. It is highly recommended that students complete BSC 2086C prior to applying or beginning the OTA program.
- 2. Students may take MGF 1130 Mathematical Thinking, STA 2023 Introduction to Probability and Statistics, or MAC 1105 College Algebra. Students must earn an appropriate score on a placement examination or complete the appropriate MAT prerequisite(s) before taking these courses.
- 3. Pursuant to Rule 6A-10.02413 of the Florida Administrative Code, all degree-seeking students must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by both passing the Florida Civic Literacy Exam and by completion of AMH 1010 (History of the United States: 1607-1877), AMH 1020 (History of the United States: 1877 to the Present) or POS 2041 (American National Government). Students may also use AP or CLEP credit for one of the three-course options.
- 4. Students must take one of the approved Humanities General Education Courses in this program: ARH 2000, HUM 2020, LIT 1000, MUL 1010, PHI 2010, or THE 1000.
- 5. The Occupational Therapy/Occupational Therapy Assistant Program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA), located at 7501 Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 510E Bethesda, MD 20814. #### **Minimum Graduation Requirements**

To qualify for graduation at Polk State College, a student must:

- 1. Complete all degree-seeking admission requirements, including the submission of all necessary transcripts and other required documents.
- 2. Complete the required credit hours in a prescribed program of study.
- 3. Complete any other applicable requirements (e.g., some occupational and technical programs require a grade of C or better in all program courses).
- 4. Have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.00. A minimum cumulative program GPA of 2.0 is required for graduation with a credit or vocational certificate, or an Applied Technology Diploma.
- 5. For Associate in Arts and Baccalaureate Degree programs <u>ONLY</u>, satisfy the foreign language requirement for graduation, which is proficiency at college-level II (or the equivalent).
- 6. Complete at least 25 percent of the credit hours required for the degree or certificate through instruction offered at Polk State College.
