



Legal Education Certificate Courses

Software Essentials for the Law Office Certificate Course

This 7-week online course is designed for legal professionals interested in improving their skills and knowledge of commonly used computer technology and programs within the law office. Course topics include: computer operating systems and peripheral devices; time tracking and billing software; database, case management and docket control software; litigation support software; electronic discovery, and trial presentation and graphics software.

Successful graduates of this non-credit course will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from Polk State Corporate College.

Topics of Study:

Hands on exercises will prepare students to work with popular programs such as MS PowerPoint, Practice Master's Tabs 3, AbacusLaw, Summation iBlaze, Trial Director and LexisNexis Casemap & TimeMap, as well as understand the common functions and purposes of similar programs.

Common billing procedures and payment agreements, accurate time tracking, proper calendar and docketing procedures as well as the processes involved in electronic discovery will be addressed through a variety of exercises. In addition, students will be presented with real-life scenarios and asked to identify and examine ethical issues raised by the use of technology in a legal practice.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Certificate Course

This 7-week online course is designed to train and qualify students to develop or participate in conflict mediation processes. Participants will review the growth and application of settlement options in the United States. The course focuses on both traditional and non-traditional dispute resolution options. Specific attention will be given to Mediation, Arbitration, Summary Jury Trials, Mini-Trials and Moderated Settlement Conferences. Students can benefit from taped live lectures or by taking the course online with the added advantage of reviewing the materials as many times as necessary for full retention of the information. Alternative Dispute Resolution is geared to all professionals who are focused on "interest-based bargaining." This course takes the mystery out of settlement processes and focuses on reaching reasonable solutions.

Successful graduates of this non-credit course will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from Polk State Corporate College. Participants will be expected to complete reading and homework assignments and will choose or be assigned project reports that deal with ADR topics.

Topics of Study:

Introduction, History and Origin of ADR-Mediation Techniques for ADR: The Mediation Process & Role of the Mediator Business Disputes, Settlement Issues in the Business Sector, Employment Disputes and Employer/Employee Relationships.

Legal Investigation Certificate Course

This course is designed to teach legal investigation to those interested in pursuing a new career and those presently working in the legal field. After successfull completion of this 7-week online course, students will be qualified to assist attorneys, paralegals, insurance companies and private businesses, as well as state and federal government agencies, in the process of civil and criminal investigation. Students will also be taught how to create a freelance investigation business. Successful graduates of this noncredit course will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from Polk State Corporate College.

Subject areas include the following: arson investigation, products liability investigation, personal injury and traffic accident forensics, employment accidents, investigation of financial and equity matters, professional malpractice and negligence, skip-tracing, and the role of a legal investigator in preparing for civil and criminal litigation.

Topics of Study:

Introduction to our legal system, legal and ethical considerations for the investigator, law of agency and coverage of rules of court and evidence.

General interviewing and investigation techniques, sources of leads and information, fact analysis, taking witness statements, forensic photography, proper service of legal process, and surveillance.

Personal injury investigation techniques, traffic accident reconstruction, premises accidents, employment accidents, government investigation, document analysis and control, financial and equity analysis, testimony, and case studies.
