## Honoring active learning and supportive teaching environments in a changing paradigm of higher education

Expand your knowledge. Broaden your resources. Spark students' inspiration.



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Whether you are using a hardcopy textbook, an online resource, or another method to introduce your content, the goal is to encourage higher level thinking and comprehension. Some students need more guidance than others in digesting new material. One of the research based strategies listed below might be beneficial in your classroom. These strategies might be used in partner or group format to encourage a supportive learning environment.

**POSSE:** predict ideas, organize ideas, search for structure, summarize main ideas, and evaluate understanding (Englert & Mariage, 1991).

**PQRST:** *preview, question, read, state* the main idea, and *test* by answering the questions posed earlier (Kelly, 1994).

**RAP:** read paragraphs, ask questions about what was read, and put in own words (Schumaker, Denton, & Deshler, 1984).

**SQ3R:** *survey* the chapter, *ask* questions about what was read, *read, recite,* and *review* (Robinson, 1961).
