

Student Achievement Data

To ensure the it is effectively fulfilling its mission, the College uses multiple methods to measure and document student achievement, including:

1. Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Outcome Measure – (This is a cohort driven, eight-year measure of student completion that is collected annually by the federal government.)
2. Florida College System Performance-Based Funding Model – (These are four student success measures that are tracked by the Florida College System. Performance on these measures are reported annually to the system colleges and are linked to state performance funding.)
3. Florida Education & Training Placement Information Program Reports – (This is a data collection and consumer reporting system established by Florida Statutes F.S. 1008.39 to provide follow-up data on former student and program participants who have graduated, exited, or completed a public education or training program within the State of Florida.)

IPEDS Outcome Measure – Eight-Year Graduation Rate

The IPEDS Outcome Measure (OM) survey component provides the award and enrollment statuses of four degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate student cohorts and eight sib-cohorts at degree-granting institutions. Student completion awards are collected at four-year, six-year, and eight-year status points after students have entered the institution. Performance Measures

Polk State College evaluates its educational programs using [Florida College System Performance-Based Funding Model and Accountability data](#), as well as, licensure pass rates. The Florida College System 2018-2019 Performance-Based Finding Model codified by [Florida Statute F.S. 1001.66](#), identifies retention, completion, completer wages, and job placement and continuing education after graduation as appropriate measures for student achievement. Retention rates were calculated using a cohort of first-time in college and first-time in upper division students from the fall. Retained students were enrolled at the same institution the following fall. Retention measure includes both beginning and end of term data for the initial and subsequent fall enrollments. Completion rates were calculated using a cohort of first-time in college and first-time in upper division students from the fall. Completers graduated within

150% or 200% of their expected time to graduation, based on their program completion and highest award earned. Job placement or continuing education rates were calculated by determining if any graduates during the year following graduation were employed or enrolled in a postsecondary institution at any time during the year. This measure includes out of state employment data through the Wage Record Interchange System 2 and postsecondary education records through the National Student Clearinghouse. Lastly, college graduate wages were calculated by utilizing a graduate's highest wage for full-time employment from the four fiscal quarters the year following graduation. Includes out of state employment data through the Wage Record Interchange System 2.
