Foreign language Proficiency is Required. Foreign language proficiency requires either completion of two years of high school instruction in the same foreign language; or completion of a minimum of eight (8) hours college credits in the same foreign language; or completion of a high school diploma from a foreign country where the student studied in a language other than English.

It is not necessary to complete the non-nursing education coursework prior to entering upper division courses; however, students are strongly encouraged to complete these courses prior to Capstone to avoid a delay in graduation. Although a preferred progression is designed for the program, as noted on the following tables, there is sufficient reinforcement of key concepts across the curriculum to enable students to be successful if courses are taken in a different order.

Students must take NUR 3825 Role Transformation in the first term of enrollment in nursing classes. When planning course sequence, please note that there are a few prerequisite courses that need to be completed in the course progression and all NUR courses must be completed before enrolling in NUR 4940, the final Capstone course. The two practicum courses are 16-weeks; all others are eight (8) weeks. The courses are offered as online classes which are not

self-paced but have assignments due per a published schedule. The 8-week framework equates to having half the time for assignments than there would be in a 16-week courses so self-discipline to stay on task is crucial. Because of the accelerated terms, students are encouraged to take no more than two classes in any term. Students will need access to a computer with a reliable Internet connection. Students must have an active, unrestricted RN license and prior to clinical courses, must be current in CPR and immunizations.
